We have been made aware of a few of our students who have presented with symptoms of Staph infection as well as Impetigo (a lot of us say Emphantigo). The students have gone to the doctor and been given antibiotics and are on the mend and some have healed completely. Please make us aware of these types of medical situations and we will be very aggressive in treating our facilities in future.

Today, we have received training in the use of equipment that was used in the treatment of the Ebola virus contracted by Dallas nurse Nina Pham. We are treating portions of the school and athletic facilities today and will continue to treat each facility weekly as we work to prevent the spread of this bacterial infection.

I have included information from WebMD regarding Staph and a brochure for Touch Point Healthy (Infection Control System). We will be using treatment chemicals that kill 99.9% of pathogens in one minute. Additionally, this system will help keep cold and flu contamination to a minimum.
